

Financial Statement

The National Endowment for the Humanities accounted for 79% of the Council's income in 2015. The remaining revenue comes from foundation partnerships, Michigan Council for Arts and Cultural Affairs and donations from individuals and businesses. Included in expenses reflected in 2015 are costs in the amount of \$595,967 covered by a contribution from WK Kellogg received in 2014.

The generous support of our funding partners and donors make the work of the Michigan Humanities Council possible. In FY 2015, 553 projects were funded, 698 statewide events hosted and 132,060 participants.
